California Department of Rehabilitation

7. New Business

Debrief of the 2015 YES Job and Career Expo

Ms. Tignac thanked all Board members and volunteers for their hard work organizing the 28th Annual YES Job and Career Expo. Event evaluation results were given. Ms. Tignac highlighted that employers felt the majority of youth participants were well-prepared and all that completed the evaluations stated that they would attend again next year.

The Board had the following comments and questions regarding the Expo:

Recommendation that the Simi Valley Unified School District and Ventura County Community College Districts' Personnel Services either attend or post openings in the Job Bank;

Add slide on how to research companies to the Interview Skills Workshop presentation;

Ms. Wigdor stated that she received positive comments from students that attended the event;

Need to find marketing solution to increase youth attendance, such as flyer in water bill, flyers on grocery store bulletin boards, theater ads or banner inside the theater:

Add presentations to scouting groups, youth groups, teen sports leagues, faith-based monthly meeting of pastors;

Instead of employer outreach by phone, have members make visits in person;

Encourage youth to attend at staggered times, such as 10:00 a.m., and 11:30 a.m.;

Additional onsite workshops for youth; such as networking and limit workshop time to 10 minutes;

More marketing on social media; Facebook page, twitter;

Add "Reality Check" portion to Interview Skills Workshop on cost of housing, car, and wage;

Research Junior Achievement workshops;

Add evaluation comments to employer invite letter.

8. Youth Employment Service Advisory Board Reports and Comments

Marybeth Jacobsen reported that the Workforce Education Coalition has begun hosting dinners at California Lutheran University. Each dinner would have a certain industry focus, such as the first in the dinner series was for small business/entrepreneurship and the focus in May would be healthcare.
