DRAFT MINUTES

1. Call to Order/Welcome

Mayor Huber called the meeting to order at approximately 3:30 p.m., welcomed Arts Commissioners, and verified that a quorum was present.

Present: Mayor Bob Huber, Council Member Mike Judge, Commissioners, Hayes, Mayea, Savell, and Cultural Arts Center Foundation Representative Feco.

Absent: Commissioners Drago and McLean

Staff Members: Sommer Barwick, Rob Bruce, and David Ralphe.

2. Agenda Review

No changes were recommended.

3. Approval of Minutes: February 18, 2015

A motion was made by Council Member Judge and seconded by Commissioner Hayes to accept the minutes as drafted. The motion was unanimously approved.

4. Public Statements

None.

5. Continued Business

None.

6. New Business

a. Review of FY 2014-15 Operating Budget and Approval of the Proposed FY 2015-16 Operating Budget

Mr. Ralphe presented an overview of the FY 2014-15 Budget report where he explained that the total income for the first nine months, while approximately 2% lower than budget projections was 7% higher than the previous year. He also explained that this was not affected by the Judy Dwyer bequest as the Commission had amended the budget at their last meeting to add the bequest income as well as its expenditure, resulting in no change in net income.

Commissioner Hayes requested clarification as to whether the authorized capital expenditure of the bequest had occurred and Mr. Ralphe clarified that the purchases have not yet been made.

Mr. Ralphe then gave an overview of the proposed FY 2015-16 Operating Budget that projects a gross revenue of \$435,150, and a projected net income of \$8,650 predicated on continuing success of programming, expanded online ticketing and social media marketing, and the Simi Valley Cultural Arts Center Foundation continuing the agreed upon fiscal support.

A motion to accept the FY 2014-15 Operating Budget report and approve the proposed FY 2015-16 Operating Budget was made by Commissioner Savell and seconded by Commissioner Hayes. It passed unanimously.

b. Review and Approval of the Proposed FY 2015-16 Operating Plan

Mr. Ralphe reviewed the proposed FY 2015-16 Operating Plan, which includes goals for maintaining the same level of programming on the main stage, but projects increased utilization of the "DownStage" for mid-week performances. It also projects increased support and collaboration with groups such as ARTS and the Nottingham Festival. Mr. Ralphe went on to explain that since the completion of the on-line ticketing, ticket sales coming through Goldstar is increasing the Center's presence in the greater L.A. region. He attributes this to local theater blogs starting to recognize the Center which is helping to draw audiences from a larger region and attract higher caliber of performers. A motion to approve the FY 2015-16 Operating Plan was made by Commissioner Hayes and seconded by Foundation Representative Feco. It passed unanimously.

 Consideration of a Request for a Fee Subsidy to Produce a Concert as a Santa Susana High School Student Senior Project

Alicia DeFrancisco, a junior at Santa Susana High School was introduced by Commissioner Hayes and then addressed the Commission. Ms. DeFrancisco explained that she is proposing to organize a string concert comprised of performers at the different schools throughout the Simi Valley as a fundraiser for the Santa Susana Music Program. The concert would be held either the third week of September 2015 or the first week in March 2016 depending on the Center's availability.

Mr. Ralphe stated that while he supports this request, he is cautious about setting a precident for students utilizing the Center for their senior projects at no expense and suggested that Ms. DeFrancisco obtain sponsors for the cost of technical staff and equipment needed for the performance and that the Commission authorize expenditure from the Performance Fund of up to \$1,000 to cover the rental fee for the Main Stage and any other expenses

that the General Manager deems necessary to facilitate the concert. A motion to approve the expenditure of up to \$1,000, at the discretion of the General Manger, to support the proposed concert was made by Council Member Judge and seconded by Commissioner Hayes. It passed unanimously.

7. Reports

a. Cultural Arts Center 20th Anniversary Season Programming Update

Mr. Ralphe reviewed the preliminary preparations for the Center's celebration of its 20th season. He stated that he has been in contact with Rita Moreno and her manager regarding reprising her performance that opened the Center in 1995. They've begun preliminary negotiations on cost and Mr. Ralphe is requesting authorization to expend a portion of the Performance Fund to negotiate Ms. Moreno's fee. As this request is not a part of this agenda item, the Commission reopened item 6.a. regarding the approval of the FY 2015-16 Budget.

6. a. Reconsideration of the Review of FY 2014-15 Operating Budget and Approval of the Proposed FY 2015-16 Operating Budget

There was a discussion about the best way to showcase Ms. Moreno's performance, the potential costs, venues and fund raising opportunities. A motion to amend the FY 2014-15 Budget to include authorization for the General Manager to negotiate a contract with Ms. Moreno to perform at the Center's 20th anniversary in the fall and expend up to \$10,000 out of the Performance Fund as a deposit for her fee was made by Council Member Judge and seconded by Commissioner Hayes. It was approved unanimously.

7. b. Update on Cultural Arts Center Statistics

Mr. Ralphe reported that the Center is generally ahead on its statistics largely due to an increased number of performances resulting from the new Downstage and an increase in the private rental of the multi-purpose room.

c. General Manager's Report

The content of this report was covered under 7.a.

d. Update on Simi Valley Cultural Arts Center Foundation Activities and Revenues

Foundation Representative Feco reviewed the status of the Foundation's endowment fund and fundraising activities. He gave an update on the

upcoming April 25, 2015 Spotlight Awards and described an extensive program of entertainment for the evening. He also announced that the Foundation's website is up and running and that tickets for the Spotlight Awards may be purchased on-line through the site. He also described the Major Gift Program that the foundation is developing with the intent of increasing the Endowment to \$1,000,000 by the Center's 25th anniversary.

8. Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Hayes announced that the Simi Valley Alliance for the Arts (formerly Simi Valley Cultural Association) is conducting a fundraiser by selling packets of tickets to local entertainment venues. The funds will be utilized to promote the organization's efforts to provide an umbrella, training and support for local arts organizations. They are also developing a website that will list all artistic and leisure activities in the City, which will include all of the performances at all of the area schools so parents will have one source for tracking their children's performance schedules.

BUDGET FY 2014-15 REPORT

Attached for your review is the Simi Valley Cultural Arts Center's Operating Budget FY 2014-15 Report (July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015). Total Income is reported at \$411,806, Total Cost of Goods sold was \$273,035 and Total Operational Expenses were \$102,926. As a result, the Cultural Arts Center (Center) is reporting a Net Profit in the amount of \$35,845. The positive net result of \$35,845 reflects a onetime bequest of \$32,924 which is restricted for the Center's phase II 'greening' project. That deducted from gross income leaves a net positive gain for FY 2014-15 of \$2,921. These financial results allow the Center to maintain its reserves, and retain a restricted Contingency Account balance of \$19,425 and a Performance Fund Reserve of \$19,260. In addition the Center has invested \$10,345 in necessary maintenance and replacement of production related equipment during FY 2014-15, including lighting instruments and cabling for the new DownStage Theater. Improvements also included the purchase of four LED colortrans which begins Phase II of the 'greening' of the building. The Center continues to be in a strong fiscal position and staff anticipates continuing operations with a positive cash flow in FY 2015-16.

The following analysis is included for your information.

Total Income (\$411,806) was 13% below (\$473,100) budget due to low attendance at two mainstage presentations; ARTS production of *Godspell* and Center's production of *The World Goes Round*. However, a previous year comparison of total income shows a 3% increase over the 2013-14 Total Income of \$400,187. In order to partially compensate for the increased cost of operating the Center, the City Council authorized raising fees and prices for the first time since 2006. The Box Office experienced some price resistance in the senior category but was able to increase income from Goldstar, a L.A. based ticket service. Also, after a few months, the sales in the senior category recovered. The drop in income was offset by a reduction of 10% in the Cost of Goods category specifically in Supplies and Artist Fees. Reduced expenditures were also realized in the Operational Expenses notably in reduced License Fees, Technical Staff costs and Capital Replacement. As a result of careful monitoring of expenditures, the Center posted a positive net profit of \$35,845 for FY 2014-15.

Staff will continue to carefully monitor revenues and expenditures in FY 2015-16 and provide a detailed report of revenue and expense status at mid-year and again at the end of the budget year. Should you have any questions regarding the above information, staff will be happy to respond at the October 14th Commission meeting.

YEAR-END CITY REIMBURSEMENT REPORT

Attached for the Simi Valley Arts Commission's review is the FY 2014-15 Simi Valley Cultural Arts Center (Center) Year-End City Reimbursement. Also attached are the quarterly Subsidized Activity Reports for the year that are utilized in calculating the City reimbursement. On March 4, 2002, the City Council approved a reimbursement program for the Center that requires that the City be reimbursed 10% of earned income (total income less grants, donations, interest and reimbursed technical costs) minus subsidized activity (providing rental space for non-profits and public entities). For FY 2014-15, 10% of earned income totaled \$31,732 and subsidies totaled \$13,575 resulting in a total of \$18,157 due the City. Staff will be available to address any questions.
