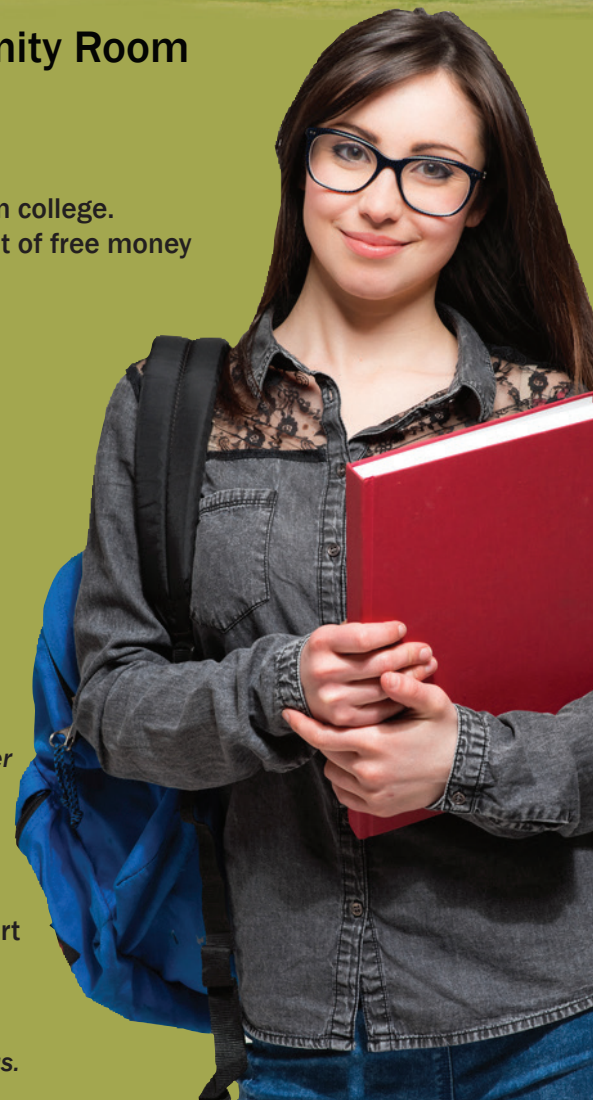
- the importance of knowing your EFC (Expected Family Contribution) before applying to schools
