1. Call to Order/Welcome/Pledge of Allegiance

2. Agenda Review

There being no objections, the agenda was approved as presented.

3. Approval of Minutes

<u>ACTION</u>: A motion to approve the October 26, 2016, minutes as written was made by Mary Bandini and seconded by Zorko Jezina.

YES Advisory Board vote: 9 Ayes; 0 Noes; 0 abstentions The motion passed.

4. Correspondence

Ms. Tignac stated that an invite was received from Bank of America's Tri-Valley Regional Council for four YES Advisory Board members to attend their year-end event on December 6, 2016.

5. Public Statements/Comments

No public statements or comments were made.

6. Informational Presentation

Workforce Investment Board Update and Ventura County Job Forecast by Brian Gabler, Director of Economic Development/Assistant City Manager

Mr. Gabler gave a brief overview of the Ventura County Economic Collaborative and Workforce Investment Board, which is now named the Workforce Development Board.

Mr. Gabler discussed current trends in Ventura County. The following key points for Ventura County were mentioned:

- Its labor market strength is in its industry sector diversity, such as agriculture, defense, leisure, health and hospitality.
- Rated #1 in the nation to live for its physical characteristics and natural elements per the Washington Post.
- Out of the 58 counties in California, Ventura County ranks in the bottom 20% when analyzing employment statistics.
- Wage growth is relatively flat, though an increase has been seen in lower paying jobs.
- Since 2007-08 Ventura County population increased by 45,000, but no change in labor force numbers.
- Real Estate shows low vacancy rates in commercial/industrial buildings with Simi Valley holding the lowest vacancy in the county. However, with very few new builds and many buildings previously used for manufacturing that are now being used as warehousing and/or distribution centers, employment rates are being kept low.

Other theories for the steady employment decline in manufacturing sector include an increase in the use of automation and higher employee productivity.

Mr. Gabler stated that some possible ways to boost the economy and job market were being discussed, such as affordable housing for the workforce and better utilization of our coastal areas for tourism and hospitality. Specifically, in Simi Valley, creating more affordable housing, which could include pushing retail into more concentrated, already developed areas zoned for that purpose.

For workforce development, he stated that it is recommended that educators concentrate on the career pathways and other educational aspects that will bridge the gap and raise a more work ready labor force through education.

Mr. Gabler also gave a brief Simi Valley specific economic development update.

7. Continued Business

Discussion of the YES Job and Career Expo Flyer Contest

Ms. Tignac stated that the GFX Design Contest online submission form is active on the City's website. Zorko Jezina stated that he would follow-up with the visual arts teachers at Royal High School to help promote the contest to their students. Ms. Tignac reported that an internship was secured through Bezign Design for the high school winner and a job-shadowing day for a middle school winner.

Students interested in entering the contest are encouraged to submit their GFX Designs directly at www.simivalley.org/2017GFX before the December 16, 2016, deadline date.

John Baxter presented ideas for a 'Career Information Expo' to be held on Saturday, February 4, 2017, at the Boys and Girls Club of Simi Valley. He stated that the event will be hosted by the Rotary Club of Simi Sunrise.

Concerns as to the similarity with the April 22, 2017 YES Job and Career Expo were discussed, as well, as potentially making the event a "preview" to the Job and Career Expo by making it be more of a career exposure day while the April event will focus on job attainment, interviewing, internships and more.
