2. Welcome/Introduction of Youth Council Members

Ms. Tignac welcomed the 2017/18 Youth Council. All members participated in a brief introduction activity.

3. Agenda Review

Ms. Tignac recommended that the Youth Council be flexible with moving Agenda Items 7 a and b and 9 c to accommodate guest presenters' schedules. There were no objections.

4. Approval of Minutes

6. Public Statements/Comments

Royal High School student and former Youth Council member Ziren Mo introduced himself.

7. Informational Presentations

a. Overview of How the City of Simi Valley and City Council Operate, City Manager Eric J. Levitt

City Manager Eric Levitt provided a presentation on City of Simi Valley's government, his role as City Manager, and answered Youth Council members' questions regarding City administration, environmental, planning and safety. Mr. Levitt also discussed his personal background and public administration philosophy.

b. Introduction of City Council Liaisons to the Youth Council

Mayor Pro Tem Mike Judge and City Council Member Glen Becerra introduced themselves as the City Council Liaisons to the Youth Council and discussed their personal backgrounds and the importance of the Youth Council to the City Council. They explained the history of the City Council liaisons to Youth Council, how funds are generated locally for City programs, and anticipated costs that will pose a challenge for the City in the future, such as significant CalPERS retirement pension increases.

8. Continued Business

a. Discussion of Suicide Prevention Campaign, including Awareness Event in Collaboration with the Simi Valley Public Library on Thursday, September 28, 2017

Youth Council member discussed logistics for the September 28 Suicide Prevention Month event. The following Youth Council members volunteered to serve as moderators for the panel discussion following the Talk Saves Lives training: Humna Ahmad, Sage Bilsland, Pranav Krishnamoorthi, Annie Kroll, Leah Nohrenberg, Chandler Nelson, and Emily Ramirez. The moderators would meet after the September 19 Youth Council meeting to develop dialog and questions to ask the suicide prevention panel.

The following members volunteered to represent the Youth Council at September 11 City Council Meeting for the City Council's proclamation of September as Suicide Prevention Month: Humna Ahmad, Sage Bilsland, Leah Nohrenberg, Ethan Strubbe. The following members would also volunteer to attend if their schedules allowed: Michelle Boland, Annie Kroll, Chandler Nelson and Sneha Sundaram

b. Discussion of Bullying Prevention Campaign, including Awareness Event in Collaboration with the Simi Valley Public Library on Thursday, October 5, 2017

Action Item updates: Emily Ramirez, Annie Kroll and Sage Bilsland stated that they had each contacted the theater departments at their respective schools. They reported that Royal, Santa Susana and Simi Valley High Schools' all were eager to participate in the Stop Bullying event on October 5, 2017. After a brief discussion, each school would be allotted 25 minutes to do an interactive Stop Bullying-related performance or program similar to Straight Up Ventura County's social change theater approach. Royal and Santa Susana High Schools would work together with Straight Up Ventura County staff.

Youth Council members discussed coordinating a citywide Stop Bullying pledge, that would include giving orange pledge bracelets to those students and community members that sign the pledge. Members also discussed coordinating Stop Bullying pledge booth at the Free Clinic of Simi Valley's annual Tooth Fairy 5k/10k Run and Community Health Expo on Saturday, October 14, 2017.

ACTION: A motion to approve the Youth Council participation in cohosting a Stop Bullying Event from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., on Thursday, October 5, 2017, and coordinating a Citywide Stop Bullying Pledge during the month of October was made by Timothy Ho and seconded by Michelle Boland.

Youth Council vote: 21 Ayes; 0 Noes; 0 Abstentions The motion passed.

- Sneha Sundaram to draft a Stop Bullying event flyer by September 15, 2017.
