Youth Council members Leah Nohrenberg and Zalma Quezada received certificates of recognition from Assemblyman Dante Acosta, recognizing members for their advocacy efforts to eradicate food insecurity in the community.

6. Continued Business

Discussion of Youth Council Work Plan

Youth Council members completed a final brainstorming activity to address issues of concern to youth raised during the October 17 and November 7, 2017, Youth Council meetings.

ACTION: A motion to approve the 2017-18 Youth Council Work Plan presented below was made by Om Patel and seconded by James Chu.

Youth Council vote: 18 Ayes; 0 Noes; 0 Abstentions The motion passed.

The 2017-18 Youth Council Work Plan will be as follows:

Research and recommend additional curriculum that teaches and builds tolerance;

Increase education on personal finance, including how to manage money;

Increase career exposure and awareness of interviewing skills to prepare students to enter the workforce;

Increase awareness of mental health resources;

Increase awareness of stress reduction techniques and coping skills;

Decrease drug and alcohol use by building awareness of negative effects on the body; and

Research and recommend integrating curriculum to teach tax filing basics possibly in conjunction with National Tax Day.

7. New Business

 Discussion of Volunteer Opportunities for the Soroptimist International of Simi Valley's First Annual STOP Human Trafficking Awareness Day in Simi Valley

Debbie Thomas, President of the Soroptimist International of Simi Valley (SISV), gave an overview of the SISV and its mission. She also stated that they were seeking volunteers to help promote their first annual STOP Human Trafficking Awareness Day in Simi Valley scheduled on January 11, 2018, at Santa Susana High School.

SISV Member Sandy Schmid routed a signup sheet for members interested in volunteering from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 6, 2018.

b. Discussion of Youth Summit Group Leader Designation

- c. Selection of the 2018 Youth Summit Application Design

Youth Summit Committee Chair Humna Ahmad distributed the application graphic designs created by the City's graphics department and stated that the committee had selected the second design as its top design choice.

Members recommended changing the font on the theme title "A World of Possibilities", switching graphic from design four and increasing the font on event title "Simi Valley Youth Summit".

Youth Summit Committee Chair Humna Ahmad gave a brief overview of past community service projects led by the Youth Council in conjunction with past Youth Summits. She also stated that the Youth Summit Committee had met and selected the top three potential donation drive recipients to present to the Youth Council as the 2018 Community Service Project.
