6. Informational Presentation

a. Presentation of the State of the Region Report

Samantha Argabrite, Deputy City Manager, discussed the 2017 State of the Region Report, prepared by the Ventura County Civic Alliance. The Alliance is a coalition of civic leaders with a commitment to the "three E's" - the economic, environmental and social equity interests of Ventura County. The Alliance publishes the report every two years. The independently researched report presents data on more than 100 quality of life indicators for Ventura County, arranged into the following key topic areas: Community Engagement & Resources; Economy; Education; Land Use & Housing; Natural & Environmental Resources; Public Health; Public Safety; Social Services; and Transportation. The report is used by elected officials, businesses, community leaders, nonprofit organizations, the educational community and may others as a tool to understand the region and prepare for the future.

b. The City's Home Rehabilitation Program for Low Income Households

Cynthia Sabatini, Senior Planner, gave the presentation. Since 1981, the City has provided loans to over 700 Simi Valley households, including seniors, families, and those with disabilities, who are not able to keep their detached single family homes in good repair. The program offers a 2% deferred interest loan, up to \$50,000, with no monthly payments. Full repayment is required when the property is sold, refinanced, leased, or when the property changes title. To be eligible for the program, the applicant must be the occupying homeowner and meet the standards for low or very low income specified in the Home Rehabilitation Program Application. Both exterior changes and interior upgrades can be made by prescreened contractors, with health and safety being the first priority.
