7. New Business

a. Discussion and Feedback on Simi Valley Municipal Code Regulations regarding Off-Street Vehicle Parking, including Recreational Vehicle (RV) Parking on Residential Properties

Stratis Perros, City Planner, and Sean Gibson, Senior Planner, explained the current regulations, noting that compared to other cities in Ventura County, Simi Valley has the most liberal regulations on off-street parking, especially allowances for parking in the front yard.

They showed a diagram of where parking is currently allowed, diagrams of other options and examples of both legal and illegal parking around the City. They then asked specific questions and solicited feedback from the Executive Board and the audience. This feedback will be provided to the City Council.

Note: there were five members of Neighborhood Council #2 present who were not able to attend the Neighborhood Council #2 meeting on April 10, 2018. They were allowed to vote at this meeting.

1. Currently, off-street vehicles are allowed to be parked on a paved area between the driveway and the nearest property line. Should they also be allowed on a paved area on the opposite side of the yard from the driveway?

2. Should the requirement that a minimum of 50% of the front yard must be landscaped remain as written, as opposed to decreasing the percentage?

3. Should vehicles, with limits as to how many, be allowed to park in the backyard in an area not adjacent to a permitted garage or carport, if they are on a paved surface?

Questions from the audience and responses from staff:

Who has the final say as to what a person can do with their property if they live in an HOA?

It would depend on which HOA the person lived in. An HOA can have more stringent regulations than the City.

Questions from the Executive Board and responses from staff:

If a property has a driveway that extends into the backyard, but there is no structure that it leads to, and the driveway predates the current regulations, could someone park a vehicle on it in the backyard area?

No, under the current regulations they could not unless they were to build a legal structure at the end of the driveway.

What should someone do if they observe people living long term in a legally parked RV?

They should contact the City's Code Enforcement division.

Can the City require someone to remove an old, unattractive RV from their driveway?

Yes, but only if it is inoperable and/or does not have a current registration.
