- 6. New Business
 - Discussion of the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute's Summer Leadership Program, by Rebekah Harding, Associate Director of Learning and Engagement

Rebekah Harding, Associate Director of Learning and Engagement for the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute, announced that through the City of Simi Valley's partnership with the Foundation, six Summer Leadership Program (SLP) spaces were designated for members of the Youth Council. Ms. Harding stated that she would send a list of the summer sessions available to Ms. Tignac. Once the Youth Council determined which session, they would then select the six members to be a part of the SLP cohort. She also stated that the program usually costs \$400 per person, which will be waived for the six selected Youth Council members.

Ms. Harding also announced that with the City of Simi Valley partnership, Youth Council members are considered SLP Alumni. As alumni, members are eligible to receive special opportunities with the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute, including invites to fun alumni events. Ms. Harding stated that those not receiving alumni emails, should contact her to be added to her alumni list.

b. Discussion and Selection of Youth Summit Catering Options for the Luncheon

Youth Summit Chair Nick Judge reported that the Youth Summit committee had met and reviewed the three catering options provided by the American Jewish University staff. He stated that the committee was indecisive and didn't have a preference for the top option.

After a hand vote, the first menu option that included a green salad, grilled cheese sandwiches, french fries, water and lemonade, plus brownies for dessert was selected as the top choice.
