 Discussion of Bullying Prevention Campaign, including A Multicultural Festival Event in Collaboration with the Simi Valley Cultural Arts Center Foundation on Saturday, October 5, 2019

Ms. Tignac announced that the Multicultural Festival Event needed to be postponed to the spring to allow adequate time to coordinate a successful event.
