DRAFT MINUTES

- 1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance Janet Plant called the Zoom online meeting to order at 1:03 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2. Roll Call Janet Plant called Roll Call. Members present were Linda Allen, Bill Fischer, Bill Oliver, Janet Plant, Suzanna Robertson, Jerie St. Germain, Pete Stong and Ed Tingstrom. Janet Plant verified there was a quorum present.
- 3. Agenda Review By consensus of the Executive Board, the agenda was approved as presented.
- 4. Approval of Minutes Ed Tingstrom moved to approve the minutes of the meeting on March 9, 2020, and Pete Stong seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Report of COA Chair

Janet Plant thanked everyone for complying with Governor Newsom's stay at home order and thanked all the front line workers for their service.

6. Representative Reports

a. City Council

Council Member Elaine Litster thanked the Senior Center staff for continuing the Senior Nutrition Programs and serving an increased number of seniors. She also voiced her concern about the impact the warmer temperatures in the forecast would have on our seniors with the Senior Center being closed. She said some businesses are re-opening according to County guidelines and the City is focusing on educating businesses about the guidelines rather than issuing fines. Mayor Pro Tem Mike Judge discussed the wellness of the whole community and especially seniors. He said wearing masks does not hurt and to continue using common sense safety precautions. Simi Valley is weathering this crisis well and is doing well in terms of finances because they have been conservatively managed.

b. Senior Center

Deputy Community Services Director Anna Medina stated that staff is serving over 100 lunches a day through the Drive-thru Pick-up Program and beginning this week a second meal (dinner) will be provided to participants. The Senior Share program is now including those on the waiting list.

Community Services Manager Angel Sierra stated the Senior Center will remain closed until further notice and it will likely re-open during Phase 4 of Governor Newsom's re-opening plan. He indicated that there has been a 12 percent increase in the Home Delivered Meals program and a 100% increase in the Pick-up Meals program. Senior Share is serving an average of 140 seniors a week. He said the Senior Center continues to provide resources and referrals to partner agencies and the newsletter will contain additional resources and contact information. The newsletter is available via email or on the City website.

Carol was in the Zoom audience and shared her difficulties in receiving transportation services because she is outside of the service area (Topanga Canyon in Los Angeles County). Janet Plant directed her to the resource pages on the City's website and the Senior Center newsletter for shopping assistance through our partner agency Senior Concerns, Inc. Ed Mazeika commended Senior Center cook Gregory Seymour and Meals On Wheels Coordinator Suzanna Colwell for working so well to ensure meals get to seniors.

Bill Oliver stated that the previous month's expenses as well as refunds due to the cancellation of the Wellness Expo were paid in April 2020. Also, there will be less earned revenue this year, again, due to the cancellation of the Wellness Expo. That deficit will be more than recuperated due to the significant individual donations that was received this year. There is also an increase in Senior Share expenses due to increase capacity on the program since the COVID-19 emergency.

SUBJECT: SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM REPORT

Senior Nutrition Program Report

The Senior Nutrition Program (SNP) at the Simi Valley Senior Center offers two meal options. The Meals On Wheels (MOW) program and Congregate Meals Program/Pick Up Meals Program (PUMP) provides a hot, nutritious noontime meal Monday through Friday to seniors (60+ and qualifying criteria). All SNP participants are given the opportunity to make a donation. Although donations are not required, they are used to offset the cost of the program.

Below is an overview of the number of meals served in these programs year to date. Due to the recent public health emergency, both programs have seen substantial increases to the demand of services compared to the start of the fiscal year. The Meals On Wheels program has seen an increase of over 15%, whereas the Congregate program has seen an increase in service of over 125% since the start of the COVID -19 emergency in March.

The below information reflects data from the Senior Nutrition Report (attached) which includes meals served and donations received.

For the period of July 1, 2019 through May 31, 2020, the Simi Valley Senior Nutrition Program report indicates that 36,063 home delivered meals were provided and \$36,086.00 was received in donations. Also, 14,873 congregate meals were served and \$12,249.48 was received in donations. The report includes a breakdown by month.
