The following conditions will apply and become part of the issued Waste Hauler's Permit:

Discharging of wastewater is allowed only during the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 pm to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

NO DISCHARGE ACCEPTED ON WEEKENDS OR HOLIDAYS.

Permittee is permitted to discharge septic tank and chemical toilet waste.

No permittee shall discharge any waste containing oil, grease, ashes, rocks, sand, mud, straw, shavings, lime sludges, viscera, metals, glass, rags, feathers, tar, wood, toxic substances or any other materials detrimental or capable of causing interference with the Water Quality Control Plant.

WASTE FROM ANY LOCATION OUTSIDE THE CITY OF SIMI VALLEY'S JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARY IS PROHIBITED.

Drivers discharging wastes from chemical toilet collection must submit a completed log with specific addresses for the load origin with each load. A blank log form will be provided for this purpose. This log and all manifests must be accurately completed. Loads without a manifest may be refused.

Driver must check in with plant personnel in the front office prior to discharging. A Waste Hauler Manifest will be required for each discharge.

Permittee may only dump at the designated dumpsite. Drivers must keep the area clean and sanitary. In the event of spills, accidental or otherwise, your company will be responsible for chlorinating and cleaning the affected area(s).

Should a spill occur the following procedures will be followed:

1. Contain the spill using absorbent materials, such as an absorbent sock, boom, etc.
2. Immediately notify Water Quality Control Plant personnel.
3. At Simi Valley Water Quality Control Plant ONLY, wash spill down into the nearest drain/catch basin.
4. Decontaminate the area.

Failure to comply will result in an invoice to your company for costs incurred for an emergency clean up of sewage. Continued non-compliance may result in revocation of the Waste Hauler's Permit.

The permittee and his employees must conform to the rules and regulations pertaining to safety regulations established by the California Division of Industrial Safety.

Water Quality Control Plant personnel may inspect the log records at any time. Each company discharging residential septic tank waste is required to submit a duplicate of the monthly report (dispatcher's log) required and submitted to the Environmental Health Department that delineates where and when wastes are being hauled. This report shall be submitted by the 15th of the month following the reporting period. All reports must be submitted to the following address: Department of Public Works/Sanitation Services Division, Attention: Pretreatment Program Coordinator, 2929 Tapo Canyon Rd, Simi Valley, CA 93063.

Any discharge from any other source (aside from a residential septic tank and chemical toilet) must be approved by the Deputy Public Works Director (Sanitation Services), prior to dumping. Sufficient analysis to determine compliance with the City of Simi Valley's Sewer Use Ordinance may be required.

Permittee's vehicles or equipment shall not be hosed down nor washed at the dumping facility.

Driver must check in with plant personnel in the front office prior to discharging. A Waste Hauler Manifest will be required for each discharge.

Waste hauler must supply and use their own tire chocks and hose with a 4" male camlock to connect to the plant discharge system.

Caps must be permanently attached to the vehicle in such a manner as to prevent any spillage and its loss to the sewage system.

Random monitoring may be performed on the discharge at the discretion of the City.

This permit is not transferable and becomes null and void upon changes in ownership or upon revocation by the City for non-compliance.

All discharges shall meet the requirements set forth in Ordinance No. 1170 (www.simivalley.org/SUO). Please pay particular attention to Article 5 Prohibitions and Discharge Limitations, Sections 6-13.603(f), 6-13.902, and Article 9 Enforcement.

In consideration for issuance of this permit, permittee agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City from and against all claims, lawsuits, liabilities, or damages arising out of or in connection with, or relating in any manner to any act or omission of permittee, its agents, employees, and subcontractors of any tier and employees thereof in connection with performance or nonperformance of work authorized by this permit.

The permittee shall thoroughly investigate any and all claims and indemnify the City and do whatever is necessary to protect the City and its officials, officers, employees, agents, and representatives as to any such claims, lawsuits, liabilities, expenses, or damages. The permittee must select an attorney acceptable to the City who will defend such proceeding and the City will control any litigation thereof. Such approval by the City will not be unreasonably withheld.

This permit will be issued in accordance with and subject to Title 6 Sanitation and Health, Chapter 12 Stormwater Quality Management and Title 7 Public Works, Chapter 1 of the Simi Valley Municipal Code.

Waste haulers must provide proof of insurance prior to the issuance of a Waste Hauler's Discharge Permit. Coverages shall be provided on either a City approved endorsement or a certified insurance policy and include an additional insured endorsement covering the CITY, its agents and employees. The following insurance will be required:

This agreement is intended to be part of the original contract of insurance. Failure to perform will establish a prima facie case for breach of contract.
