Ms. Tignac reported that correspondence had been received from Nikki Collier with the Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District (District) regarding Youth Council's interest in hosting a carnival booth at the District's Halloween Carnival on Monday, October 31, 2022.

 - a. Discussion of the 2022-23 Youth Council Work Plan

The following dates and events were discussed for inclusion in the 2022-23 Youth Council Work Plan:

- The District's Heritage Halloween and Movie in the Park event on Saturday, October 22, 2022;
- City of Simi Valley City Expo, in conjunction with the Simi Valley Street Fair on Saturday, October 29, 2022;
- Annual Youth Town Hall on Friday, January 20, 2023;
- Potential Talent Show in November/Early December;
- In Mid-November possible Youth Council participation in the City's annual Volunteer Fair;
- Mental Health Awareness Month Campaign in May 2023;
- Wellness Event in collaboration with the SVUSD before the end of May 2023;
- Fun Teen Event in collaboration with the Simi Valley Public Library in Fall 2022;
- 2023 Youth Summit with a potential date of Friday, March 10, 2023 at the District's Activity Center on Guardian Street; and
- Idea for Butterfly Project (in January or April).

Members briefly discussed issues of concern, including mental health, substance abuse, environmental issues, public transportation, college/career and financial education, and inclusivity.

<u>Action Item</u>: Members to gather input from their classmates regarding issues that they are most concerned about, which will also be used to determine the Youth Town Hall discussion topic.

b. Discussion and Selection of the Youth Council Representative to the YES Advisory Board

Due to unforeseen circumstances Maya Maizland is unable to attend YES Advisory Board meetings, hence a new representative is needing to be selected. Chloe Drury volunteered to be the representative.

ACTION: A motion to approve Chloe Drury as the Youth Council Representative to the YES Advisory Board was made by Ian Nelson and seconded by Jasleen Khangura.

7. New Business

a. Scheduling and Appointment of Youth Council Informational Report Presenters to the City Council on October 24 and November 14

Youth Council Coordinator Kristin Tignac reviewed the tasks of the Informational Report presenters and asked for volunteers for the upcoming dates: October 24 and November 14. Anika Nedunuri volunteered to present on October 24 and Abhishek Jagannathan volunteered to present on November 14.

d. Discussion of the Youth Town Hall on Friday, January 20, 2022

Ryan Fowler with RRPFI and Ian Nelson gave an overview of the event. November 15, 2022 was confirmed as the date for Youth Town Hall speaking role auditions. Members discussed potential discussion panel topics to address during the Youth Town Hall.

By consensus, members agreed to hold off on making final decisions until members collected input from classmates on what issues they were concerned about.

b. Discussion of an Opportunity for an Event Collaboration with the Simi Valley Unified School District

Jennifer Wigdor, counselor and Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) Coordinator for SVUSD discussed the opportunity for a possible event collaboration with the Youth Council. She reported that the SVUSD was awarded a Tobacco Use and Prevention Grant each year. Ms. Wigdor asked the Youth Council members for input on what type of event they thought would be effective. The idea of a Wellness Expo with several different components was popular among the members. Ideas included, inviting Art Trek and BRITE Youth, as well as having the expo focus on art, music, nutrition, and performing arts. Members discussed potentially holding the event in April or May 2023.

ACTION: A motion to approve the Youth Council collaborating to host a TUPE event with SVUSD was made by Yihan Wang and seconded by Christopher Kricorian.

Youth Council Vote: 20 Ayes; 0 Noes; 0 Abstentions

The motion passed.

c. Discussion of the 2022 Bullying Prevention Campaign

Youth Council members discussed ideas for a 2022 Bullying Prevention Campaign. Members preferred to coordinate the Stop Bullying Pledge banner at their booth during the City Expo on Saturday, October 29, 2022. They also planned for a social media campaign tasking the Social Media Committee to develop the content.

ACTION: A motion to approve a Stop Bullying Pledge and a social media campaign as the 2022 Bullying Prevention Campaign was made by Zehong Situ and seconded by Advaith Nair.
