6. Continued Business

a. Discussion of the 2022-23 Youth Council Work Plan

Members discussed annual and upcoming events available for Youth Council participation, including hiding painted rocks at Rancho Tapo Community Park (aka Lemon Park) and Rancho Simi Community Park (aka the Duck Park) at a date to be determined by Google form availability responses.

ACTION: A motion to approve the Youth Council's participation in the annual Volunteer Fair on Wednesday, November 16, 2022 was made by Ian Nelson and seconded by Abhishek Jagannathan.

Ms. Tignac reviewed previous Youth Council Work Plans for the Youth Council to use as an example. Members separated into smaller work groups to discuss and develop potential solutions for the main issues that resulted from the Google survey and issues gathered during peer discussions at each school.

Each Work Plan Topic team selected a representative to present their brainstormed issues and solutions. Youth Council members then completed a dot vote to rank the issues and corresponding solutions.

The 2022-23 Youth Council Work Plan is as follows to address the top prioritized issues of Mental Health and Social Media, Discrimination and Bullying, and Substance Use:

- 1. Research and advocate for mental health days to be included as school excused absences;
- 2. To reduce the impacts of social media use on teen mental health, coordinate a campaign for unplugged days;
- 3. To raise awareness and reduce discrimination, develop and promote awareness or spirit-type days on campuses for anti-discrimination;

- 4. To reduce discrimination and help students that feel uncomfortable by perceived mistreatment, research uses for the School District's anonymous tip system to see if students can report instances of discrimination; and
- 5. To decrease substance use among teens, co-host a Wellness Expo with the Simi Valley Unified School District before June 2023.

After reviewing the top results from the Google survey and Youth Council member discussions with peers, the following motion was made.
