MAKE A PLAN

Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so it's important to prepare a plan in advance to know how you'll reconnect.

Discuss with your household how you will get in touch with each other. Charge your communication devices and carry a charging cable and power bank with you.

EMERGENCY SUPPORT NETWORK

Ask at least **two** people to be in your emergency support network: family, friends, neighbors, caregivers, coworkers, etc. They can relay messages, update you on the disaster status, and help you find resources.

BUILD A KIT

Your emergency supply kit should have everything your household needs to take care of yourselves for at least 3 days immediately following an emergency.

Remember those in your household with special needs (e.g. babies, children, pets, the elderly, those dependent on medical equipment or medications, and those with access and functional needs.)

FOOD + SUPPLIES

- At least a 3-day supply of water and non-perishable food per person
- Complete change of clothes and shoes
- Can opener, paper cups, plates, plastic utensils, and paper towels



TOOLS + SAFETY ITEMS

- Flashlight and batteries
- Crank or battery-operated radio
- Cellphone chargers and backup batteries
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Wrench (to turn off utilities)
- Fire Extinguisher



MEDICAL NEEDS

- Prescription and non-prescription medications and glasses
- First Aid Kit



PERSONAL + COMFORT ITEMS

- Personal hygiene items and feminine supplies
- Sleeping bag and warm blanket for each person
- Books, puzzles, toys, and activities for children.
- Paper and pencil



EXTRA CASH

- Cash and change (to cover fuel, lodging, and meals for your family for several days)



BUILD A KIT



IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

- Identification cards, insurance policies, bank account information, birth certificates, medical records, contact lists etc.

PET-FRIENDLY CHECKLIST

- Pet food and extra water (3-day supply)
- Medicine and First Aid kit
- Collar with ID tag and harness or leash
- Traveling bag, crate or sturdy carrier
- Grooming and sanitation supplies
- Toys, treats, and bedding
- Description and current photos of pets

BABIES + CHILDREN

- Diapers and wipes
- Bottles and formula
- Child-specific medications, creams, etc.
- Baby food jars or pouches
- Portable crib and blankets
- Change of clothes and shoes

EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT TIPS

- Add items to your emergency supplies kit that best suit your needs, including dietary and medical needs.
- Consider having at least two emergency supply kits, one full kit at home and smaller portable kits in a vehicle or workplace.
- Store your kit in a place that is easy to reach.
- Check and refresh your kit twice a year.
- Check batteries and replace as needed.

VC Alert is an emergency notification system for Ventura County that is used to alert residents during an emergency. Before the next emergency, be sure to register and update your home or business address, landline, cell phone, email, and TTY device to receive emergency alerts. Alerts will be sent in both English and Spanish.

The **MyShake App** delivers earthquake early warning alerts for earthquakes magnitude 4.5 and greater.

MyShake keeps you informed about earthquakes and provides a quick way to contribute and see damage reports.

The **FEMA App** is a personalized disaster resource that can help you learn basic preparedness strategies.

With the FEMA App, you can receive real-time weather updates from the National Weather Service for up to five locations nationwide. It can also help you find a nearby shelter if you need to evacuate and give you the tools you need to recover after a disaster.

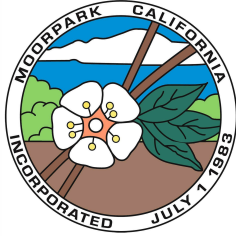
The **Red Cross Emergency App** combines more than 35 different types of severe weather and emergency alerts. You can choose the alerts that are most important to your location or the location of loved ones. The "Family Safe" feature allows you to notify loved ones that an alert has been issued in their area and check in to see if they are safe.

The **Weather Channel App** allows you to track daily weather forecasts, receive live radar updates, storm alerts, and local precipitation updates. Stay prepared during extreme weather events with live breaking news alerts sent to your mobile device.
