# 5. Public Statements/Comments

Nicholas Becerra explained that time is allotted for public statements/comments at each Youth Council meeting for items that pertain to the Youth Council. He stated that statements/comments are limited to five minutes per speaker.

Monica Zarate addressed the Youth Council on the subject of distracted driving. She explained how her daughter and her friend were killed when the car they were carpooling in to Moorpark College was hit by a distracted driver. Ms. Zarate explained how important it is to not text or talk on the phone while driving.

Sergeant Buckley emphasized how important this issue is and explained that he has had to make several death notifications to family members of those killed by distracted drivers.

#### 6. Informational Presentations

c. Simi Valley Unified School District's Voluntary Random Drug Testing Program by Cheri Toyen, Intervention Counselor

Ms. Toyen explained the voluntary student random drug-testing program that is proposed for the next school year. Under this program, parents will be able to sign students up for the random testing at Simi Valley Hospital. The school district has negotiated a cost of \$10 per drug test. Under the program, each month, up to ten  $9^{th} - 12^{th}$  grade students district wide will randomly be chosen to have the test. Parents will need to authorize the testing and the results will only be released to the parents. The District will not receive a report on the results. If the student is selected for testing, the District will pay the fee. However, if the parent wants the student tested and they are not randomly selected, they simply need to get the correct form from the school and they will also be able to pay only \$10 for the test. The test normally costs \$70.

Ms. Toyen answered several questions about the program.

b. Simi Valley Police Department K9 Drug Searches

Sergeant Buckley explained how the K-9 unit operates and how K-9s are used. Each dog is trained for a duel purpose, usually to search for and identify people and to either search for and identify narcotics or explosives. Dogs are never trained to search for both explosives and narcotics, as there is no way to be certain what they have identified.

The Police Department does use K-9s to search school premises and lockers for narcotics, but never to search students for safety and liability purposes. The purpose of the searches is to discourage students from bring or using drugs on campus.

Sergeant Buckley answered several questions about searches and the K-9 training.

a. Youth Crime by Community Liaison Officer Brennan, Simi Valley Police Department

Officer Brennan presented statistics for calls for service at the City's schools during all of 2013 and January – April of 2014. During this time period, there were over 2,000 calls for service. Officer Brennan went on to explain that the calls for service are listed by address, so traffic citations occurring in front of a school, pedestrians on the sidewalk adjacent to schools and actual calls to the school campus are all considered calls for service at the school's address.

Officer Brennan answered several questions about specific statistics for area schools.
